

About our school

SBNLC is a non-profit community school offering Nepali language to students in South Australia. Founded in 2012 by the local Nepali-speaking Bhutanese community, our goal is to help families maintain their traditional language, literature, arts and culture.

We preserve and promote the language and cultures of Nepali-speaking communities through a weekend language-based school that focuses on fun, positive relationships and culture.

Since it was founded in 2012, SBNLC has been a member of the Ethnic Schools Association of SA, an umbrella body representing ethnic school authorities operating in the State. In its early days, the school was known as the Bhutanese Ethnic School, under the auspices of the Bhutanese Australian Association of South Australia. In July 2019, the school became known under its current name.

To become a world-class institute promoting Nepali language and culture in diaspora.

The school is held on Saturdays at the Salisbury Primary School, 10 Compuda Street, Salisbury (northern Adelaide suburbs).

Our students

We have about 150 students, supported by 45 teaching and non-teaching volunteers. We welcome children of any age group from Kindergarten to Year 12.

We welcome any volunteers to our community school. We would not exist without the dedication, effort and commitment shown by our volunteers.

SBNLC offers classes throughout school terms to students aged from Reception to Year 12. Classes are held once per week, every Saturday from 10.30am to 12.30pm.

Entertaining school activities to make learning fun

Our students have opportunities to participate in different forms of fun activities to keep them entertained, while at the same time learning new skills in Nepali Bhutanese language and culture. Activities include:

- music and dance classes every week
- literature writing and poem reciting
- art including an exhibition
- celebrating festivals and historical events
- quizzes and drama.
